Part 1

- Joe initially felt the contractor would not follow through on the submitted proposal and thought to recommend disqualification and termination. He asked himself “Am I providing the same rigor to all the proposals?”
 - What are Joe’s responsibilities as a steward of the profession?
 - Why do you think Joe is struggling with this decision?

Part 2

- “If they got the contract, I would’ve done everything possible to make it successful.”
 - How does this statement demonstrate Joe’s commitment to honorable service and stewardship?
 - What does his decision say about his character?
- Take the time to write down (or raise your hand) and share with the group how Joe’s honorable service and stewardship set an example for his organization to follow.
 - Can you share an experience where you faced a situation where you had to make a decision to do the harder right?
 - How did you come to the decision to do so? What was the outcome?
