The High Ground

This simulation sends the learner on a journey through a series of challenging scenarios that stimulates ethical reasoning. This product provides the learner with verbal feedback and an after-action report.

True Faith and Allegiance

This scenario-based training product offers new Army trainees the opportunity to understand and apply the Army Values to everyday decisions. This product will aid the learner in making moral judgements and addressing issues such as sexual harassment and hazing.

The Company We Keep

In the "Company We Keep," users will become the lead character in an interactive movie through the eyes of the Company Commander or 1SG of either a Reserve Component Military Police company or a Regular Army Transportation company, where they will make choices as a new Command Team.

A Special Trust

In "A Special Trust," users have the opportunity to navigate strategic level decisions, where they are challenged to consider their role as Stewards of the Profession, and the second and third order effects of their decisions.

Highly Specialized, Highly Committed

"Highly Specialized, Highly Committed" is a virtual simulation training product that focuses on Army Profession and Ethic concepts and how they relate to the leader/professional development of Soldiers as they transition into the Warrant Officer cohort.

Backbone of the Army

In "Backbone of the Army," you become a rising Platoon Sergeant who faces formidable challenges in both garrison and deployed environments. This video includes sexual harassment issues and resilience training.

The Future is Now

The scenes are set in a typical college/university where you are a first or second year ROTC Cadet. The video features lifestyle situations that address conflicts with Army officership. Contains scenes that focus on alcohol abuse and sexual harassment.

Dedicated to the Profession

As a member of the Army Civilian Corps, you make a key contribution to the success of the mission—helping to grow the Army as a Profession and not just a bureaucracy. In "Dedicated to The Profession," you get the opportunity to experience the mission as a new Army Civilian employee, a new prior service Army Civilian, and a new supervisor. Each character provides its own insights into different aspects of the Army Civilian's role in the Army Profession.

Keeper of the Colors and Our Profession

In this virtual simulation, you get to face the home station leadership and ethical challenges of a new Battalion Command Team or Brigade Command Team.

This product puts you in realistic situations that will challenge your critical thinking and decision making skills. The goal of this virtual simulation is to help develop Character, Competence, and Commitment in junior leaders.




ARMY DOCTRINE
