Honor: Live up to the Army Values

Materials: Facilitator Guide Case Study Exercises

Task	Sustain Soldier Professional Development through instruction on the Army Values and Professional Ethic.
Conditions	Given classroom or operational area, use the provided materials to discuss what it means to live and infuse the Army Values into our everyday actions.
Standard	Explains the Army Value of Honor through a Soldier's story and how to live it.

Motivator: The honor of an American Soldier is living the virtues of our profession. It is honoring our country, our forefathers, and our ideals through our actions. To be honorable is to live up to and embody all of the Army Values. As honorable Soldiers, we understand courtesy and the traditions of our military - and know how each of those connect to decisions we make every day.

Facilitator opening question:	Q- How can you live up to all of the Army Values? Examples of how to live up to the Army Values <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Be honest with yourself- Understand the profession- Know what's at stake as a Soldier- Respect our traditions and past- Embrace the legacy of our country and our fallen comrades
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Honor--It's the result of putting the Army Values into action. Honor is the Army Profession lived through our choices, actions, thoughts, and words. As we live honorable lives we create a legacy for future generations to follow.
